All enrolled ECU Students are entitled to vote in the Guild Elections. Each student is entitled to one vote in each election.

- Completed postal vote applications must be received by the Returning Officer not later than 12.00pm on Tuesday 7 October 2025.

ELECTION BY IN-PERSON VOTING

The 2025 Guild Election uses Polling Places with in-person voting. There is no online voting.




